#### **INNOVATION**

The first universities, music conservatories and academies of fine arts were established in Italy, in the 11<sup>th</sup> century.

Among the 10 oldest universities in the world, 5 are Italian. More than 10 academies and conservatories are among the most ancient.

Today 14 business incubators and 22 scientific parks foster innovation in both arts and technology in partnership with the Higher Education System.



The Italian HE System is organized in three cycles, according to the principles of the European Higher Education Area (EHEA). Specific qualifications are associated with each cycle, allowing students to progress with their studies, participate in public recruitment competitions, take part in all European mobility programs, enter the labour market and develop professional careers.

HE study and degree courses are structured in credits. A **credit** (CFU for Universities, CFA for AFAM) is equivalent to about 25 hours of student workload, including individual study. Conventionally the average workload of a full-time student in one academic year corresponds to 60 credits. The CFU/CFA system is based on the ECTS system adopted by the EHEA.

Italy has a policy of support for **outstanding students** coming from all over the world, who can apply for grants, accommodation and financial support.





# THE THREE CYCLES FOR UNIVERSITIES AND FOR ARTS AND MUSIC HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS (AFAM)

- 1st cycle (Bachelor level): Corso di Laurea and Corso di Diploma Accademico di I livello (180 credits; 3 years)
- 2<sup>nd</sup> cycle (Master level): Corso di Laurea Magistrale and Corso di Diploma Accademico di II livello (120 credits; 2 years) Corso di Laurea Magistrale a ciclo unico (single-cycle course: from 300 to 360 credits; from 5 to 6 years)
- 3<sup>rd</sup> cycle (PhD level): Corso di Dottorato di Ricerca (3-4 years) Specialization Course (variable duration)

#### A first cycle degree gives access to:

- Corso di Laurea Magistrale, Corso di Diploma Accademico di II livello or
- Master Universitario di I livello (professionally-oriented post-graduate course - I level), or
- Diploma di Specializzazione di I livello (Specialization Degree I level)


#### A second cycle degree gives access to:

- Master Universitario di II livello (professionally-oriented post-graduate course - II level)
- Specialization Course
- Diploma di Specializzazione di Il livello (Specialization Degree – Il level)





#### THE ITALIAN UNIVERSITY SYSTEM







## HOW TO BE ONE OF US

If you are a non-EU student you need an entry visa (before leaving your country) and a residency permit (upon your arrival) for study purposes. Unless you apply for a programme taught in English, you will also need to know Italian in order to enrol.

The Italian Diplomatic-Consular Missions can provide all the information you will need on the procedure.

#### **Pre-enrolment steps:**

- **choose** the study programme and the Higher Education Institution you prefer from the Universitaly website (www.universitaly.it);
- **verify** any entry requirements, costs and services (residence, aid to outstanding and economically disadvantaged students, language courses, etc.) directly with the chosen Institution or on its website;
- collect all the documentation required;
- submit your school/academic qualification to the chosen institution for the necessary evaluation;
- apply for a visa at the Diplomatic-Consular Missions in your home country, and submit your request formally.
