VLIR-UOS Scholarships to study in Flanders (Belgium)



VLIR-UOS awards scholarships to applicants from 31 eligible countries in Africa, Asia and Latin America to attend one of the selected trainings or Master programmes taught in English at a Belgian (Flemish) university or university college, covering all related expenses.

A call for scholarship applications is launched every year in November. The deadline for submission depends on the training or Master programme you are applying for.

The 15 available Master programmes will be organised for 5 years (2017-2021). The training programmes will be organised in 2020.

Development-relevant programmes

VLIR-UOS supports a selection of development relevant master- and training programmes, organised at a Flemish university or university college ranking among the best in Europe.

The International Master Programmes (ICP) are accredited, initial or advanced Master programmes (EQF 7) of one or two years (60 or 120 ECTS) on a development-relevant subject. The programmes have a specific but non-exclusive focus on participants from the global South, with specific courses, applicable content and adapted teaching- and learning methods. Each programme is supported with twelve scholarships.

The International Training Programmes (ITP) are short- or medium term, intensive, interactive, and applicable trainings, targeting participants from the global south with relevant professional experience in the topic of the ITP and who are in the possibility to transfer and thus multiply the obtained knowledge and skills to a wider audience in their home country. VLIR-UOS provides a limited number of scholarships in order to facilitate the participation of the targeted participants.

VLIR-UOS supports 15 International Master programmes with a limited number of scholarships. Each year a call for candidates is launched in November for the following academic year. Eligibility criteria for a scholarship

Nationality and country of residence: A candidate should be a national <u>and</u> resident of one of 31 scholarship countries at the time of application



Age: The maximum age for a Master programme candidate is 35 years for an initial masters and 40 years for an advanced masters. The candidate cannot succeed this age on January 1 of the intake year. No age limit for the training programmes.

Professional background: VLIR-UOS gives priority to candidates who are employed in academic institutions, research institutes, governments, social economy or NGO's, or aim a career in one of these sectors. The training candidate should have relevant professional experience and a support letter confirming (re)integration in a professional context **Former VLIR-UOS scholarships:** A candidate can only submit one VLIR-UOS scholarship application per year, irrespectively of the scholarship type. As a consequence, a candidate can only be selected for one VLIR-UOS scholarship per year.

The Master programme candidate has never received a scholarship from the Belgian government to attend a master programme or equivalent or was never enrolled in a Flemish higher education institution to attend a master programme or equivalent before January 1 of the intake year.
